- Reading Comprehension: Teaches children to understand and think critically about

- Writing: Improves writing skills, enabling clear expression.
- Foundational Numeracy: Teaches basic math concepts that solve everyday problems.

Implementation of NIPUN Bharat:

- The **Department of School Education and Literacy** oversees the program at the national level.
- State and Union Territory (UT) governments create local plans for implementation.
- The National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) conducts foundational learning studies to track progress.

Key Features of NIPUN Bharat:

- Rs 500 per child for teaching materials to make learning more engaging.
- Rs 5,000 per teacher for capacity-building workshops, and Rs 150 for learning resources.
- States are given:
 - Rs 10-20 lakh for student assessments.
 - Rs 25 lakh to Rs 1 crore for setting up Project Management Units at state and district levels.

Success Stories of NIPUN Bharat:

- Uttar Pradesh: Teachers use songs to make math more interesting. ASER 2024 reports an increase in Grade III students' reading ability from 24% to 34%, and subtraction skills rose from 29% to 41%.
- Odisha: The use of colorful, contextualized workbooks has helped children, like Shragatika Ghosh, improve their reading skills.
